
- Revisits addition and subtraction of 0 to and from any number.



1. **TIMELINE-** Ask your Child to make a timeline of how they used to be when they were in play school, in nursery, in KG and in P1. They should write about the things they used to do, their hobbies, they can also draw the pictures of themselves during these different classes.

Post activity -later when they will bring that activity to the class, the children will discuss about the changes and similarities they see in their looks as well as their hobbies.

2. **FAMILY TREE**- Ask your child to make a family tree by pasting pictures of their family members and mentioning their relation with that person. They will also find out about one hobby of each of the family member by asking that person or anybody else in their family.

3. **0-99 NUMBER CUPS**

The idea is to make any number from 0-99 by turning the cups.









We play several different "games" with the number cups.

- The child makes a number and reads it.
- The parent makes a number and the child reads it.

- The parent calls out a number and the child makes it.
- The child calls out a number and the parent makes it.
- A random spin of the cups and the child reads the number.
- The parent will write a number on paper and have the child make it with the cups.
- The parent talks about a real-life number (i.e. "Daddy will be 31 on his birthday." or "There are 56 pages in this book.") and then the child makes the number with the cups.
- The parent will ask a question that has a number answer and the child will answer by making the number with the cups. ("What is your date of birth?" -06)
- The parent will make a number and then will ask what number comes before or after it.

We keep the cups sitting on the kitchen table so that we pick them up often to play with for a few minutes here and there.



4. COUNTING AROUND THE HOUSE

a) Gather your materials. You will need some paper, markers and something to put the paper on the wall. I use painter's tape,



- b) Draw a house.
- c) Decide what things you want to count and write them on. I made the windows and doors spots to write the numbers in.



- d) The child reads the questions on the poster.
- e) Count
- f) Come back and fill in the answers.
- g) Your questions should also have numbers with 2-digits.
- h) Search your house poster to see which question has the biggest number and which is the smallest.

5. ORDERING ORDINALS STORYTIME

Give students between 10 and 20 cards with pictures or vocabulary on that they can use to tell a story. They work in pairs to decide on a story and put the cards in order, then change pairs and tell their stories one picture at a time to someone else. After each sentence, that person has to guess which picture the person telling the story put at that point and tell them using ordinal numbers, e.g. "I think this was your fifth picture".

- 6. NAMING WORDS- Ask your child to observe carefully all the things they see while travelling from home to school and vice-versa. Then they will be asked to write down the names of these words and classify them according to name, place, animal and thing.
- 7. NOUNS- Ask them to write down the names of any 5 people they see in or around their house, place in and around their house, any animal they find around their house and 5 things kept in their house.

8. ROLL THE DICE

PLAYERS-two or three person can play

Material Required-a cardboard on which numbers from 1 to 100 written in grid form, dice and two different types of button.

The game will start from 1. Diner will throw the dice and will move on the cardboard according to the number. Then the next person will count the boxes as per the number on the dice and move on the number grid. The child who will reach 100 first will win the game.
